Leader: On this day our Lord went again to Jerusalem.
On the evening in the Upper Room, Jesus shared sacred time with his disciples.
It had all been arranged, right down to the smallest detail.

He washed the feet of the disciples, shared in the sacred Passover meal
with his friends, and instituted the sacrament of His Body and Blood which
we share together tonight.
He spoke words of comfort and peace, gave the promise of the coming of the
Holy Spirit, and made the great intercession.
In the Garden of Gethsemane, He endured His agony.
Betrayed by Judas and arrested by His enemies, He was taken to prison and
to judgment.

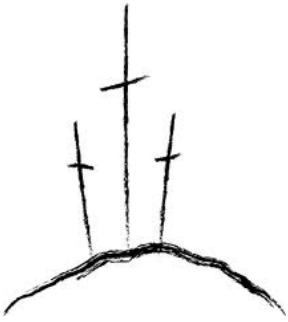
